I am PCSO Dan Gordon, welcome to this month's bulletin from the Hythe Safer Neighbourhoods team.

This month we have seen an increase in the amount of rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour calls.

This may be due to the hot summer weather which is always a busy time for the police.

During the summer months we are putting in extra anti-social behaviour patrols to target this behaviour with the aim to decrease this rowdy behaviour.

The school year is nearly over and I am sure that youngsters will be out and about enjoying their time off and some will be involved in underage drinking. Parents should be aware that if they buy alcohol for children, it may result in them getting an £80 fine as it is an offence.

The period June 15, to June 21, was National Neighbourhood Watch week. This was designed to make people aware of the benefits of Neighbourhood Watch.

This month there has been a force wide initiate on drugs. A number of warrants have been carried out and a small amount of drugs have been seized.

A nine year old boy from Hythe was caught shoplifting from a local shop. When asked why he did this, he replied that he was made to do so by another boy. As the boy was younger than 10 he cannot be arrested, however, I have spoken to the boy's parents about this and strong words of advice have been given. If you think that your child may be hanging around with the wrong sort of people and are being influenced to do things against their will, please call us.

The CCTV for the Hythe area is still an ongoing process and is schedules to be with us at some point later on this year.

A new anti-social behavior campaign was launched on July 1. This is a force wide campaign and is aimed to reduce incidents of anti-social behavior which impacts on quality of life issues for many of us. A key priority for this campaign is to increase public confidence in the police service. By having an increased police presence in local neighbourhoods and by tackling hot spot areas, we hope we can achieve this. Unlike previous months, the amount of deliberate fires (arson) that were started has dropped dramatically.



We have worked closely with Hampshire Fire & Rescue Service and the local council to reduce this by tackling known offenders and hot-spot areas where deliberate fires have been caused.

Hythe Safer Neighbourhoods team are always looking for information from the local community to help us identify those involved in criminal activity or those who disrupt the harmony and quality of life within our neighbourhoods.
