## Hi and welcome to this month's newsletter from the Hythe Safer Neighbourhoods team.

### Halloween and bonfire night



Halloween and Bonfire night were both successful for us this year, with very few reported incidents to our control room. I am pleased to say that there was only one incident reported on

Halloween: a man received a fine for setting off a firework in a public place. This is normally one of the busiest times for Hampshire Constabulary. We conducted high visibility patrols within the parish on both nights which seem to have been effective.

### Begging – update

We have arrested a man who was regularly begging in the area.

### Vehicle nuisance

There have been a few vehicles driving in an anti-social manner through the Hythe Marina. Please can drivers be aware that if you are driving in an anti-social manner, police can issue you with a Section 59 warning. This means that if you are caught driving in this manner again within the year, your vehicle

will be seized regardless of whether you are using the same vehicle as you were when the first warning was issued.

### Anti-social behaviour

Certain properties around the parish are being targeted by local youths. The youths are tormenting residents by knocking and kicking their doors, ringing their door bells and throwing things at their properties. This type of anti-social behaviour can be extremely intimidating and distressing, particularly for elderly residents and those with disabilities. We would like to warn the offenders that we are watching out for this type of behaviour and have a good idea who you are. Do not let this happen again or you **will be caught**.

If you or your property are being targeted then please contact a member of your Safer Neighbourhoods team at Hythe police station by calling **101** and we can discuss how to resolve these issues. We are here to offer you support and advice.
