



HYTHE SAFER NEIGHBOURHOODS BEAT REPORT November 2008

Welcome to this parish bulletin from the Hythe Safer Neighbourhoodsteam. I'll start by introducing myself. I am police community support officer (PCSO) Andy Spooner and I have recently moved to Hythe from Fawley. I work along side PC Mick Wellsted (Hythe & Dibden) and PC Aubry Hendy Dibden Purlieu & Netley View. Together we make up the Hythe Parish Safer Neighbourhoods team (SNT).

We have split Hythe parish into two different police beats. Hythe and Dibden, and Dibden Purlieu and Netley View. On the right hand side you can see the number of calls we have received on each beat.

In Hythe and Dibden PC Wellsted and I have been working with the council, youth workers and local residents to reduce youth related nuisance. We have given talks at the local youth club about anti-social behaviour. This sort of behaviour may be low level crime however it has a high impact on people's lives. I will stress the problems are caused by the minority and we are working together to identify these youths and take the necessary action.

I have also been working closely with both Noadswood and Applemore schools to tackle the increasing problem of truanting. I would ask that anybody that knows where groups of school children are loitering when they should be at school get in touch. This way I can increase my patrols in those areas.

PC Hendy has been targeting drug issues in the Hythe area. Five drug warrants have been executed in the past six weeks leading to four people being detained and a quantity of drugs and drug paraphernalia being seized for destruction.

Over the Hythe Parish we have also had a number of vehicle thefts and breaks. Be sure to secure your vehicles and not to leave any valuables on show. Any suspicious behaviour you encounter should be reported. If you require any more information on vehicle crime, leaflets and car stickers are available at Hythe police station.

With the dark evenings and winter weather now well and truly upon us it is vital that we all take that extra caution while using the roads and ensure that vehicles and cycles are in a road worthy condition.
